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

A cruel irony of right-hand-path religions is they have been very successful because of their focus on a sense of community. In order to accomplish this, they set strict rules for behavior and belief, which leads to impairments of personal freedoms. A definition of 'community' from the Oxford dictionary is "a feeling of fellowship with others, as a result of sharing common attitudes, interests, and goals." This is where the irony comes in; in order to maintain a community, restrictions have to be placed in order for the common attitudes, interests, and goals to be maintained.

It is for this reason that many alternative path religions fall short. By increasing personal freedoms, there is a loss of community. The religion instead becomes a group of people, but each doing their own thing. There may be interaction between them, but there is less cohesiveness between them.

In chemistry there are different forces which form interaction or bonds between molecules. One of the weakest is the Van der Waals force. An overly simplistic way of viewing this is that when atoms are brought a certain distance near each other, the electrons rearrange slightly so each atom is slightly positively charged on one side and slightly negatively charged on the other side. This is very subtle and only effective at very specific distances. Too close and the total electrons in each atom repel one another, and too far away and there isn't the rearranging of electrons. This force causes a slight attraction to objects which, when multiplied over a great surface area can add up to tremendous force. Consider spiders and many other arthropods that are able to hang upside down on smooth surfaces, such as glass. The pads on the ends of their feet utilize Van der Waals forces to maintain a dry adhesion.



A covalent bond is when an electron is directly shared between two atoms. Since the electron is shared evenly between the two, the bond is strong and stable. It is this rigid nature that makes molecules form shapes. A chain of hydrogen and carbon atoms, in single bonds, forms this crooked structure. Since only one electron is shared at each point, you can rotate the various parts fairly freely. It can go from a crooked chain, to a curved chain, and then curve the other direction based on how the individual bonds rotate. If two or more electrons are shared, rotation is limited at that point, so that area becomes stiff.

Ionic bonds are when an electron isn't shared, it is transferred from one atom to another. Sodium Chloride is a commonly used example. Atoms with only a single electron in its outer shell like to give away that electron, because full shells are more stable. Likewise, atoms with one electron missing in its outermost shell like accepting an electron to stabilize its shell. Sodium atoms have three electron shells, with only a single electron in its outermost. Chlorine also has three electron shells, but its outer shell has seven electrons, while the maximum electrons that can fit in the outermost shell are eight. It may seem like an imbalance, but one gives to another which has a need and both are

fulfilled/strengthened/stabilized by it. As a result, one atom develops a positive charge and the other develops a negative charge and they become bound by electrostatic forces. In certain situations such as when dissolved in water, the atoms are free to move around, but as water evaporates, the atoms come back into proximity again. Sodium by itself is extremely reactive and a dangerous substance, chlorine is a poison once used as a chemical warfare agent. By the sodium giving an electron to the chlorine, both become stable and exceptionally useful for our biological processes. For example, nerve cells rely on sodium and chloride that have swapped electrons for signal transmission.

The bonds we should cultivate within the Temple should not be the rigidity of the right-hand path, like covalent bonds. Nor should they be as flimsy of some of the left-hand path religions, like Van der Waals. The Ionic Bond represents a shared investment in one another while still providing stability and strength. While water can separate the atoms of an ionic bond, there is a limit to the amount that can be broken, and the bonds always reform once dried out. No matter how much water you dissolve the salt in, or how vigorously you stir it; it always returns to being salt.
